
ONS Mid-2020 Small Area Population Estimates

1. Purpose of Briefing Paper

- 1.1 On 17th September 2021 the Office for National Statistics (ONS) released mid 2020 population estimates at small area level.
- 1.2 These included official estimates of the resident population at both ward and Lower Super Output Area (LSOA) level.
- 1.3 These figures are consistent with figures previously released on 25th June 2021 which estimated Hull's mid 2020 population at a local authority level (259,126).
- 1.4 This briefing, focussing on ward level population estimates, presents the current population of each ward including a breakdown of the population by age.
- 1.5 It also looks at the change in population both in the last year and since 2011; including changes in the broad age of the population within each ward over this period.
- 1.6 Further detailed population data at ward and Lower Super Output Area level is available on the Hull Data Observatory.

2. Actions

- 2.1 Detailed information needs to be shared with all Services to ensure that council documents and indicators use current population data.
- 2.2 Services should consider the impacts on business planning, current and future policy development.

3. Summary of Findings

- 3.1 In 2020 the average population size of a ward is 12,339; slightly lower than the average population size of a ward in the previous year (12,370).
- 3.2 The ward with the largest population is now North Carr ward; with 16,545 residents. This is the first year since population data using the new ward geographies has been available where Beverley and Newland ward (16,261) is not the largest ward.
- 3.3 The ward with the smallest population continues to be Kingswood ward; with 5,860 residents. This has been the smallest ward since 2011; the earliest date that population data using the new ward geographies is available.
- 3.4 With an average age of 43.4 years old, residents of Ings ward remain the oldest.
- 3.5 Conversely, with an average age of 32.8 years old, residents of University ward are now the youngest. They are marginally younger than residents of the traditionally youngest Kingswood ward; where the average resident age is now 32.9 years old.

- 3.6 The largest proportion of children aged 0 – 15 remains in Orchard Park ward (27.7%). High proportions are also found in North Carr (27.1%), and Marfleet (26.3%). The smallest proportion is in Avenue (15.7%) and Beverley & Newland (13.0%) wards.
- 3.7 The largest proportion of older residents aged 65 + remains in Ings ward (23.1%). High proportions are also found in Pickering (22.3%), Sutton (21.6%) and Bricknell (20.8%) wards. The smallest proportion is in Central (9.7%) and Kingswood (4.7%) wards.
- 3.8 Over the last year, seven wards (out of 21) have seen an increase in population. North Carr ward has seen the largest increase in actual number of residents (+369 residents; 2.3%) whilst University ward has seen the largest percentage increase (+307 residents; 2.9%).
- 3.9 Conversely, fourteen wards (out of 21) have seen a decrease in population over the same period. Beverley and Newland ward has seen the largest decrease in actual number of residents (-343 residents; -2.1%) whilst Holderness ward has seen the largest percentage decrease (-306 residents; -2.7%).
- 3.10 Longer term, since 2011, nine wards (out of 21) have seen an increase in population. North Carr ward has seen the largest increase in actual number of residents (+2,566 residents; 18.4%) whilst Kingswood ward has seen the largest percentage increase (+1,647 residents; 39.1%).
- 3.11 Conversely, twelve wards (out of 21) have seen a decrease in population over the same period. Marfleet ward has seen both the largest decrease in actual number of residents and the largest percentage decrease (-1,069 residents; -7.4%).
- 3.12 Since 2011, the largest increase in actual numbers of children and young people (aged 0 – 15) occurred in North Carr ward (+860, 23.8%) whilst the largest percentage increase occurred in Kingswood ward (+463, 50.5%).
- 3.13 Over the same period the largest increase in actual numbers of older people (aged 65 +) occurred in Sutton ward (+489, 21.7%) whilst the largest percentage increase occurred in Kingswood ward (+177; 177.0%).
- 3.14 North Carr, St Andrews and Docklands, Newington and Gipsyville, Central, University and Kingswood wards have all seen an increase across every broad age group since 2011.
- 3.15 Conversely, Marfleet ward saw population decline in every broad age group since 2011.

4. Mid 2019 Ward Level Population

See Table 1

- 4.1 In 2020 the average population size of a ward is 12,339.
- 4.2 The ward with the largest population is North Carr ward; with 16,545 residents. Other significantly larger than average wards include Beverley & Newland (16,261), St Andrews & Docklands (16,134) and Orchard Park (15,508) wards.
- 4.3 The ward with the smallest population is Kingswood ward; with 5,860 residents. Other significantly smaller than average wards include Bricknell (7,729), Pickering (7,959) and Ings (8,802) wards.

- 4.4 With a median age of 43.4 years old, residents of Ings wards are the oldest. The median age is also above average in Pickering (42.3), Bricknell (42.3) and Sutton (41.5) wards.
- 4.5 Conversely, with a median age of 32.8 years old, residents of University ward are the youngest. The median age is also below average in Kingswood (23.9), North Carr (33.2) and Orchard Park (34.7) wards.
- 4.6 The largest proportion of children aged 0 – 15 is in Orchard Park ward (4,301; 27.7% of residents). High proportions are also found in North Carr (27.1%) and Marfleet (26.3%) wards.
- 4.7 The largest proportion of young adults aged 16 - 24 is in University ward (3,086; 28.4% of residents). A high proportion is also found in Beverley and Newland ward (24.6%).
- 4.8 The largest proportion of younger working age residents aged 25 – 49 is in Kingswood ward (2,629; 44.9% of residents). High proportions are also found in Central (42.8%), St Andrews & Docklands (41.9%) and Avenue (41.2%) wards.
- 4.9 The largest proportion of older working age residents aged 50 - 64 is in Holderness ward (2,439; 22.0% of residents). High proportions are also found in Bricknell (21.9%), Ings (21.6%), Boothferry (21.0%) and Sutton (20.8%) wards.
- 4.10 The largest proportion of older residents aged 65 + is in Ings ward (2,037; 23.1% of residents). High proportions are also found in Pickering (22.3%), Sutton (21.6%) and Bricknell (20.8%) wards.

5. Population Change Since 2019

See Table 2

- 5.1 Over the last year, seven wards (out of 21) have seen an increase in population. North Carr ward has seen the largest increase in actual number of residents (+369 residents; 2.3%) whilst University ward has seen the largest percentage increase (+307 residents; 2.9%).
- 5.2 St Andrews & Docklands (+184 residents) and Southcoates (+154 residents) wards also saw above average population growth in real numbers terms.
- 5.3 Conversely, fourteen wards (out of 21) have seen a decrease in population over the same period. Beverley and Newland ward has seen the largest decrease in actual number of residents (-343 residents; -2.1%) whilst Holderness ward has seen the largest percentage decrease (-306 residents; -2.7%).
- 5.4 The number of children aged 0 – 15 increased in eleven wards; most significantly in North Carr (+130 residents; 3.0%) and Beverley and Newland (+60 residents; 2.9%) wards.
- 5.5 Conversely, the number of children aged 0 – 15 decreased in ten wards; most significantly in Holderness (-126 residents; -5.9%), Drypool (-60 residents; -2.8%) and Boothferry (-56 residents; -2.4%) wards.
- 5.6 The number of young adults aged 16 - 24 increased in nine wards; most significantly in University ward (+255 residents; 9.0%).
- 5.7 Conversely, the number of young adults aged 16 - 24 decreased in twelve wards; most significantly in Beverley and Newland ward (-474 residents; -10.6%).

- 5.8 The number of younger working age residents aged 25 – 49 increased in six wards; most significantly in North Carr (+146 residents; 2.5%), Southcoates (+138 residents; 2.6%), St Andrews and Docklands (+112 residents; 1.7%), Beverley and Newland (+87 residents; 1.6%) and Newington and Gipsyville (+65 residents; 1.2%) wards.
- 5.9 Conversely, the number of younger working age residents aged 25 – 49 decreased in fifteen wards; most significantly in Holderness (-124 residents; -3.3%), Kingswood (-123 residents, -4.5%) and Bricknell (-116 residents; -4.9%) wards.
- 5.10 The number of older working age residents aged 50 – 64 increased in eleven wards; most significantly in Drypool (+72 residents; 3.20%), St Andrews and Docklands (+61 residents; 2.4%), Kingswood (+61 residents; 6.4%) and Central (+52 residents; 2.8%) wards.
- 5.11 Conversely, the number of older working age residents aged 50 - 64 decreased in ten wards; most significantly in Southcoates (-64 residents; -2.2%), Marfleet (-55 residents; -2.4%), Derringham (-51 residents; -2.1%) and Sutton (-48 residents; -1.8%) wards.
- 5.12 Finally, the number of older residents aged 65 + increased in eleven wards; most significantly in Sutton (+53 residents; 2.0%), Avenue (+46 residents; 2.8%), Newington and Gypsyville (+38 residents; 2.2%) and University (+32 residents; 2.9%) wards.
- 5.13 Conversely, the number of older residents aged 65 + decreased in ten wards; most significantly in Orchard Park (-33 residents; -1.6%), Marfleet (-28 residents; -1.5%) and Derringham (-25 residents; -1.1%) wards.
- 5.14 Over the last year North Carr ward is the only ward to have seen an increase across every broad age group.
- 5.15 The following wards saw an increase in every broad age group except the one shown: Newington and Gipsyville (16 – 24), Southcoates (50 – 64), St Andrews and Docklands (16 – 24) and University (0 – 15)
- 5.16 Ings ward is the only ward to have seen a decrease across every broad age group.
- 5.17 The following wards saw a decrease in every broad age group except the one shown: Derringham (0 - 15), Pickering (0 - 15), Bricknell (50 - 64), Sutton (65 +), Boothferry (65 +) and Holderness (50 - 64)

6. Population Change Since 2011

See Table 3

- 6.1 Since 2011, nine wards (out of 21) have seen an increase in population. North Carr ward has seen the largest increase in actual number of residents (+2,566 residents; 18.4%) whilst Kingswood ward has seen the largest percentage increase (+1,647 residents; 39.1%).
- 6.2 St Andrews & Docklands (+1,454 residents), Newington and Gipsyville (+1,374) and Central (+1,196) wards also saw above average population growth in real numbers terms.
- 6.3 Conversely, twelve wards (out of 21) have seen a decrease in population over the same period. Marfleet ward has seen both the largest decrease in actual number of residents and the largest percentage decrease (-1,069 residents; -7.4%).

- 6.4 Beverley and Newland ward (-921 residents) also saw above average population decline in real numbers terms.
- 6.5 The number of children aged 0 – 15 increased in fourteen wards; most significantly in North Carr (+860 residents; 23.8%), Beverley and Newland (+554 residents; 24.2%), Newington and Gipsyville (+527 residents; 18.9%) Orchard Park (+513 residents; 13.5%) and Kingswood (+463 residents; 50.5%) wards.
- 6.6 Conversely, the number of children aged 0 – 15 decreased in seven wards; most significantly in Holderness (-214 residents; -9.7%) and Sutton (-101 residents; -4.1%) wards.
- 6.7 The number of young adults aged 16 - 24 increased in just three wards; most significantly in University ward (+265 residents; 9.4%).
- 6.8 Conversely, the number of young adults aged 16 - 24 decreased in eighteen wards; most significantly in Beverley and Newland ward (-1460 residents; -26.8%).
- 6.9 The number of younger working age residents aged 25 – 49 increased in eight wards; most significantly in North Carr (+1,015 residents; 20.4%), St Andrews and Docklands (+578 residents; 9.3%), Central (+551 residents; 11.5%), Kingswood (+516 residents; 24.4%) and Newington and Gipsyville (+490 residents; 9.9%) wards.
- 6.10 Conversely, the number of younger working age residents aged 25 – 49 decreased in thirteen wards; most significantly in Holderness (-707 residents; -16.4%), Sutton (-650 residents, -14.7%) and Derringham (-608 residents; -13.8%) wards.
- 6.11 The number of older working age residents aged 50 – 64 increased in sixteen wards; most significantly in Kingswood (+488 residents; 93.0%), North Carr (+435 residents; 21.3%), Newington and Gipsyville (+429 residents; 19.2%) and St Andrews and Docklands (+343 residents; 15.0%) wards.
- 6.12 Conversely, the number of older working age residents aged 50 - 64 decreased in five wards; most significantly in Sutton (-251 residents; -8.7%), West Carr (-211 residents; -8.3%) and Longhill and Bilton Grange (-193 residents; -8.2%) wards.
- 6.13 Finally, the number of older residents aged 65 + increased in seventeen wards; most significantly in Sutton (+489 residents; 21.7%), West Carr (+446 residents; 22.3%), North Carr (+418 residents; 32.6%), Holderness (+406 residents; 25.9%) and Southcoates (+369 residents; 18.2%) wards.
- 6.14 Conversely, the number of older residents aged 65 + decreased in just four wards; Marfleet (-156 residents; -7.9%), Orchard Park (-101 residents; -4.7%), Pickering (-94 residents; -5.0%) and Longhill and Bilton Grange (-64 residents; -2.7%) wards.
- 6.15 Since 2011, Kingswood, Central and University wards have seen an increase across every broad age group.
- 6.16 The following wards saw an increase in every broad age group except the one shown: North Carr (16 – 24), St Andrews and Docklands (16 – 24), Newington and Gipsyville (16- 24), Southcoates (16 - 24) and Beverley and Newland (16 – 24).
- 6.17 Marfleet ward is the only ward to have seen a decrease across every broad age group.

- 6.18 The following wards saw a decrease in every broad age group except the one shown: Longhill and Bilton Grange (0 – 15). Pickering (0 – 15), West Carr (65 +) and Sutton (65 +).

7. LSOA Population Change

See Maps 1 - 3

- 7.1 The mid 2020 population estimates are also available at Lower Super Output Area (LSOA) level.
- 7.2 The LSOA with the highest total population are focussed around Northern Kingswood, the University, Hedon Road, the Beverley Road / Spring Bank / Ferensway / Freetown Way junction, the Coultman Street area and the area south of Boothferry Road between Boothferry Roundabout and Fiveways Roundabout (covering the old Boothferry Park site).
- 7.3 The LSOA with the smallest population are the St Johns Grove / Holmpton Grove area south of Preston Road and the Bellfield Avenue area.
- 7.4 Between 2019 and 2020, population increase has been focussed around Northern Kingswood, the University, Hedon Road and the City Centre.
- 7.5 Over the same period, population decline has been largely focussed on the St Johns Grove / Holmpton Grove area south of Preston Road, the Grantley Grove / Welbury Grove area east of Marfleet Lane, and the De Grey Street / Lamber Street / Grafton Street area west of Beverley Road.
- 7.6 Longer term, between 2011 and 2020, population increase has been focussed around Northern Kingswood, the old Riley School site between Spring Bank West and Anlaby Road, the area south of Boothferry Road between Boothferry Roundabout and Fiveways Roundabout (covering the old Boothferry Park site) and the Hawthorne Avenue / old Amy Johnson school area.
- 7.7 Over the same period, population decline has been largely focussed on St Johns Grove / Holmpton Grove area south of Preston Road and the Bellfield Avenue area.

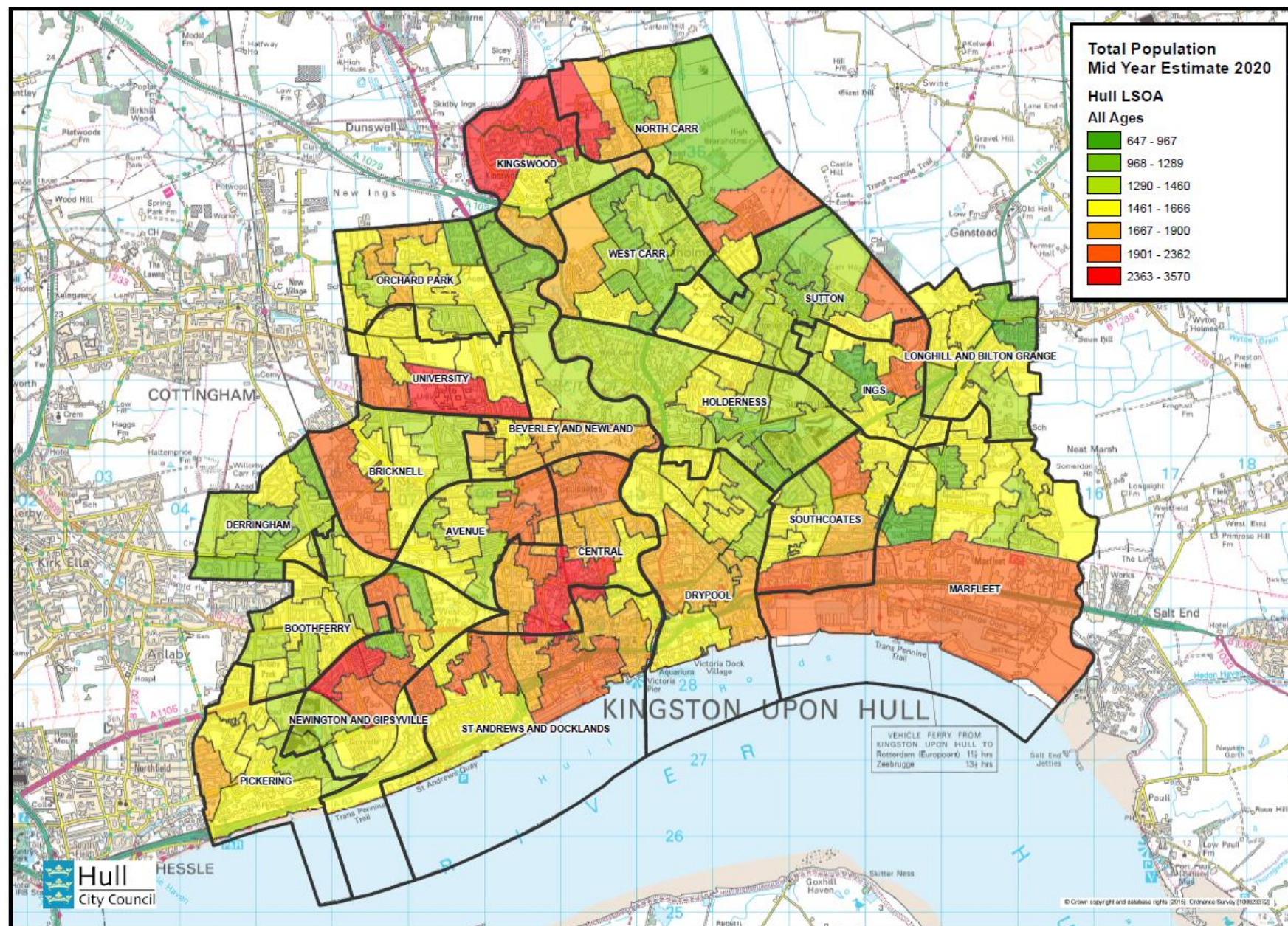

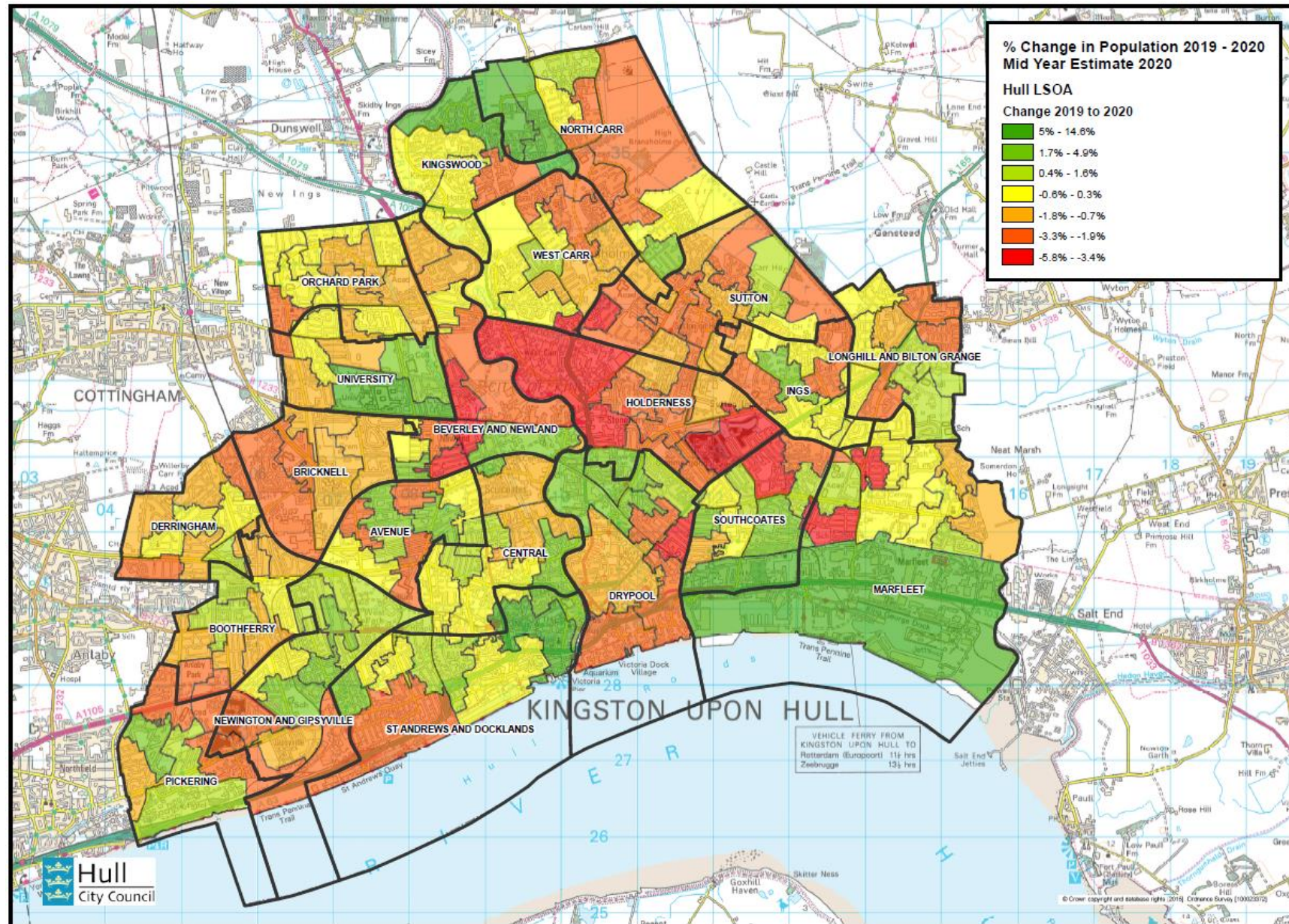
