
ONS Mid-2022 Small Area Population Estimates

1. Purpose of Briefing Paper

- 1.1 On 19th March 2021 the Office for National Statistics (ONS) released mid-2021 and mid-2022 population estimates at small area level.
- 1.2 These included official estimates of the resident population at both ward and Lower Super Output Area (LSOA) level.
- 1.3 The mid-2022 figures are consistent with figures previously released on 23rd November 2023 which estimated Hull's mid-2022 population at a local authority level (268,852).
- 1.4 This briefing, focussing on ward level population estimates, presents the current population of each ward including a breakdown of the population by age.
- 1.5 It also looks at the change in population both in the last year and since 2011; including changes in the broad age of the population within each ward over this period.
- 1.6 Further detailed population data at ward and Lower Super Output Area level is available on the Hull Data Observatory.

2. Actions

- 2.1 Detailed information needs to be shared with all Services to ensure that council documents and indicators use current population data.
- 2.2 Services should consider the impacts on business planning, current and future policy development.

3. Summary of Findings

- 3.1 In 2022 the average population size of a ward is 12,802; higher than the average population size of a ward in 2020 (12,339).
- 3.2 The ward with the largest population is now Newington and Gipsyville ward; with 17,164 residents.
- 3.3 The ward with the smallest population is now Pickering ward; with 8,500 residents.
- 3.4 With an average age of 43.3 years old, residents of Ings ward remain the oldest.
- 3.5 Conversely, with an average age of 31.3 years old, residents of Kingswood ward are the youngest.
- 3.6 The largest proportion of children aged 0 – 15 is in Marfleet ward (3,533; 26.3% of residents). High proportions are also found in Orchard Park (25.9%), Kingwood (25.8%), and North Carr (24.9%) wards.

- 3.7 The largest proportion of older residents aged 65 + is in Ings ward (2,138; 23.3% of residents). High proportions are also found in Pickering (23.2%), Sutton (22.3%) and Bricknell (21.3%) wards.
- 3.8 Over the last year, thirteen wards (out of 21) have seen an increase in population. Beverley and Newland ward has seen both the largest increase in actual number of residents, and largest percentage increase (+645 residents; 4.2%).
- 3.9 Conversely, eight wards (out of 21) have seen a decrease in population over the same period. Derringham ward has seen both the largest decrease in actual number of residents, and largest percentage decrease (-141 residents; -1.2%).
- 3.10 Longer term, since 2011, twelve wards (out of 21) have seen an increase in population. Kingswood ward has seen both the largest increase in actual number of residents, and largest percentage increase (+5765 residents; 136.8%).
- 3.11 Conversely, nine wards (out of 21) have seen a decrease in population over the same period. Marfleet ward has seen both the largest decrease in actual number of residents and the largest percentage decrease (-1,031 residents; -7.1%).
- 3.12 Since 2011, the largest increase in children and young people (aged 0 – 15) occurred in Kingswood (+1,654 residents; 180.6%)
- 3.13 Over the same period the largest increase in older people (aged 65 +) occurred in Sutton ward in Sutton (+746 residents; 33.1%),
- 3.14 Since 2011, Kingswood and University wards have seen an increase across every broad age group.
- 3.15 Whilst no ward experienced a decrease across every broad age group, the following wards saw a decrease in every broad age group except the one shown: Marfleet (50 - 64) and West Carr (65 +).

4. Mid 2022 Ward Level Population

See Table 1

- 4.1 In 2020 the average population size of a ward is 12,802.
- 4.2 The ward with the largest population is Newington and Gipsyville ward; with 17,164 residents. Other significantly larger than average wards include St Andrews & Docklands (16,966) Beverley & Newland (16,183), and Orchard Park (16,101) wards.
- 4.3 The ward with the smallest population is Pickering ward; with 8,500 residents. Other significantly smaller than average wards include Bricknell (8,516), Ings (9,189) and Kingswood (9,978) wards.
- 4.4 With an average age of 43.3 years old, residents of Ings wards are the oldest. The average age is also above average in Pickering (42.9), Sutton (42.6), Boothferry (42.5) and Bricknell (42.4) wards.

- 4.5 Conversely, with an average age of 31.3 years old, residents of Kingswood ward are the youngest. The average age is also below average in University (32.0) and North Carr (35.0) wards.
- 4.6 The largest proportion of children aged 0 – 15 is in Marfleet ward (3,533; 26.3% of residents). High proportions are also found in Orchard Park (25.9%), Kingwood (25.8%), and North Carr (24.9%) wards.
- 4.7 The largest proportion of young adults aged 16 - 24 is in University ward (4,220; 34.8% of residents). A high proportion is also found in Beverley and Newland ward (17.3%).
- 4.8 The largest proportion of younger working age residents aged 25 – 49 is in Kingswood ward (4,648; 46.6% of residents). High proportions are also found in Central (41.9%) and St Andrews & Docklands (41.0%) wards.
- 4.9 The largest proportion of older working age residents aged 50 - 64 is in Holderness ward (2,625; 21.9% of residents). High proportions are also found in Boothferry (21.6%) ward.
- 4.10 The largest proportion of older residents aged 65 + is in Ings ward (2,138; 23.3% of residents). High proportions are also found in Pickering (23.2%), Sutton (22.3%) and Bricknell (21.3%) wards.

5. Population Change Since 2021

See Table 2

- 5.1 Over the last year, thirteen wards (out of 21) have seen an increase in population. Beverley and Newland ward has seen both the largest increase in actual number of residents, and largest percentage increase (+645 residents; 4.2%).
- 5.2 Central (+405), University (+396) and North Carr (+366) wards also saw above average population growth in real number terms.
- 5.3 Conversely, eight wards (out of 21) have seen a decrease in population over the same period. Derringham ward has seen both the largest decrease in actual number of residents, and largest percentage decrease (-141 residents; -1.2%).
- 5.4 Marfleet (-141) and Ings (-115) wards also saw above average population decline in real number terms.
- 5.5 The number of children aged 0 – 15 increased in nineteen wards; most significantly in Beverley and Newland (+212 residents; 9.4%) and Central (+123 residents; 5.8%) wards.
- 5.6 Conversely, the number of children aged 0 – 15 decreased in two wards; specifically Orchard Park (-62 residents; -1.5%) and Derringham (-15 residents; -0.7%) wards.
- 5.7 The number of young adults aged 16 - 24 increased in seven wards; most significantly in University ward (+265 residents; 6.7%).
- 5.8 Conversely, the number of young adults aged 16 - 24 decreased in thirteen wards; most significantly in Marfleet (-128 residents; -8.4%), St Andrews and Newington (-109 residents; -5.4%), Beverley and Newland (-98 residents; -3.4%) and Avenue (-71 residents; -5.0%) wards.

- 5.9 The number of younger working age residents aged 25 – 49 increased in twelve wards; most significantly in Beverley and Newland (+434 residents; 8.0%), St Andrews and Docklands (+253 residents; 3.8%) Central (+219 residents; 4.9%) and Newington and Gipsyville (+193 residents; 3.0%) wards.
- 5.10 Conversely, the number of younger working age residents aged 25 – 49 decreased in nine wards; most significantly in Derringham (-86 residents; -2.2%) and Holderness (-67 residents; -1.7%) ward.
- 5.11 The number of older working age residents aged 50 – 64 increased in eight wards; most significantly in North Carr (+71 residents; 2.9%), Beverley and Newland (+40 residents; 1.5%), Central (+39 residents; 2.1%) and Avenue (+32 residents; 1.3%) wards.
- 5.12 Conversely, the number of older working age residents aged 50 - 64 decreased in thirteen wards; most significantly in Newington and Gipsyville (-60 residents; -2.0%), Pickering (-48 residents; -2.4%) and Marfleet (-47 residents; -2.0%) wards.
- 5.13 Finally, the number of older residents aged 65 + increased in nineteen wards; most significantly in Sutton (+98 residents; 3.4%), Newington and Gipsyville (+72 residents; 3.8%), and Drypool (+71 residents; 3.7%) wards.
- 5.14 Conversely, the number of older residents aged 65 + decreased in only one ward; Southcoates (-34 residents; -1.3%) ward.
- 5.15 Over the last year Central, University and North Carr wards have all seen an increase across every broad age group.
- 5.16 The following wards saw an increase in every broad age group except the one shown: St Andrews and Docklands (16 – 24), Avenue (16 – 24), Beverley and Newland (16 – 24), Longhill and Bilton Grange (50 – 64) and Kingswood (50 – 64).
- 5.17 No ward experienced a decrease across every broad age group.
- 5.18 Derringham ward saw a decrease in every broad age group except for 65+ year olds.

6. Population Change Since 2011

See Table 3

- 6.1 Since 2011, twelve wards (out of 21) have seen an increase in population. Kingswood ward has seen both the largest increase in actual number of residents, and largest percentage increase (+5765 residents; 136.8%).
- 6.2 Newington and Gipsyville (+3,791)m St Andrews & Docklands (+2,286 residents), and University (+2,060) wards also saw above average population growth in real number terms.
- 6.3 Conversely, nine wards (out of 21) have seen a decrease in population over the same period. Marfleet ward has seen both the largest decrease in actual number of residents and the largest percentage decrease (-1,031 residents; -7.1%).
- 6.4 Beverley and Newland ward (-921 residents) also saw above average population decline in real number terms.

- 6.5 The number of children aged 0 – 15 increased in fourteen wards; most significantly in Kingswood (+1,654 residents; 180.6%), Newington and Gipsyville (+1,109 residents; 39.7%), and St Andrews and Newington (+913 residents; 40.0%) wards.
- 6.6 Conversely, the number of children aged 0 – 15 decreased in seven wards; most significantly in West Carr (-217 residents; -8.0%) ward.
- 6.7 The number of young adults aged 16 - 24 increased in just one ward; University ward (+1,399 residents; 49.6%).
- 6.8 Conversely, the number of young adults aged 16 - 24 decreased in twenty wards; most significantly in Beverley and Newland ward (-2,665 residents; -48.8%).
- 6.9 The number of younger working age residents aged 25 – 49 increased in eight wards; most significantly in Kingswood (+2,535 residents; 120.0%) and Newington and Gipsyville (+1,716 residents; 34.5%) wards.
- 6.10 Conversely, the number of younger working age residents aged 25 – 49 decreased in thirteen wards; most significantly in Drypool ward (-663 residents; -13.1%).
- 6.11 The number of older working age residents aged 50 – 64 increased in eighteen wards; most significantly in Kingswood (+913 residents; 173.9%), Newington and Gipsyville (+690 residents; 30.9%), and St Andrews and Docklands (+649 residents; 28.4%).
- 6.12 Conversely, the number of older working age residents aged 50 - 64 decreased in three wards; most significantly in Sutton (-145 residents; -5.0%) and Longhill and Bilton Grange (-136 residents; -5.7%) wards.
- 6.13 Finally, the number of older residents aged 65 + increased in eighteen wards; most significantly in Sutton (+746 residents; 33.1%), Holderness (+599 residents; 38.3%), and West Carr (+563 residents; 28.1%) wards.
- 6.14 Conversely, the number of older residents aged 65 + decreased in just three wards; most significantly in Marfleet ward (-141 residents; -7.2%).
- 6.15 Since 2011, Kingswood and University wards have seen an increase across every broad age group.
- 6.16 The following wards saw an increase in every broad age group with the exception of 16 – 24-year-olds: Newington and Gipsyville, St Andrews and Docklands, and North Carr,
- 6.17 No ward experienced a decrease across every broad age group.
- 6.18 The following wards saw a decrease in every broad age group except the one shown: Marfleet (50 - 64) and West Carr (65 +).

7. LSOA Population Change

See Maps 1 and 2

- 7.1 The mid 2025 population estimates are also available at Lower Super Output Area (LSOA) level.

- 7.2 The LSOA with the highest total population are focussed around the University, Northern Kingswood, the Riley Way housing development off Spring Bank, the Coltman Street area, the Bellfield Avenue area, and the area south of Boothferry Road between Boothferry Roundabout and Fiveways Roundabout (covering the old Boothferry Park site).
- 7.3 The LSOA with the smallest population are the Broad Oak / Ark Royal area, the area of Sutton covering Howdale Road / Wisteria Way / Kestrel Avenue, the Stanbury Road area near to Haworth Park RUFC, and the Woodcock Street / Dairycoates Avenue area.
- 7.4 Between 2021 and 2022, population increase has been focussed around Northern Kingswood, the streets between Newland Avenue and Beverley Road, the University, the City Centre and Hawthorn Avenue.
- 7.5 Over the same period, population decline has been largely focussed on the Hedon Road area, Bricknell Avenue, the Lowgate / Chamberlain Street area of Sutton, and the area near to the Alderman Cogan school.
- 7.6 It is not possible to study longer term population change at Lower Super Output Area level as LSOA boundaries changed in 2021 following the Census. Therefore the LSOA at which 2022 and 2023 data has been released are not comparable with the LSOA used in earlier population releases.

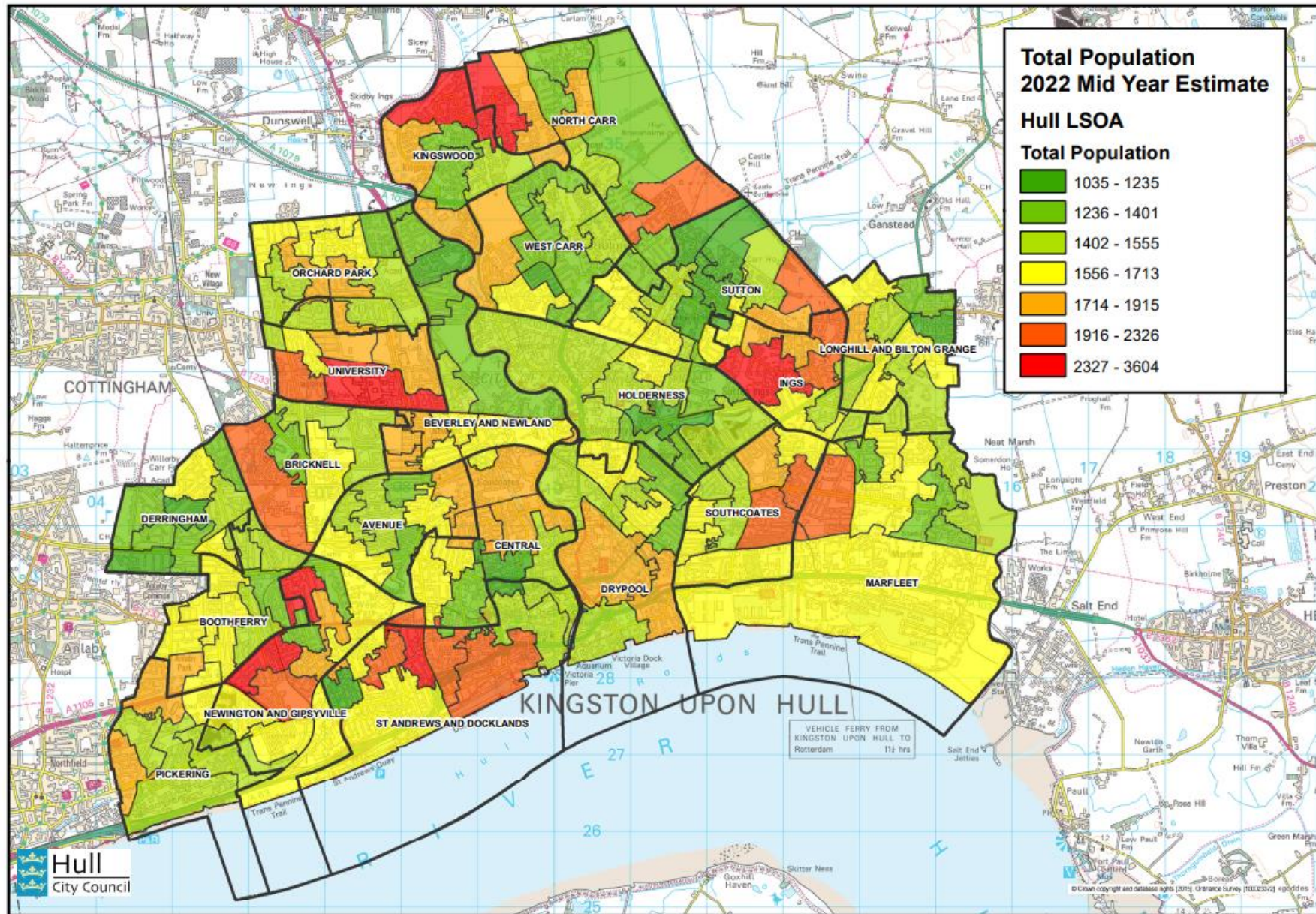
