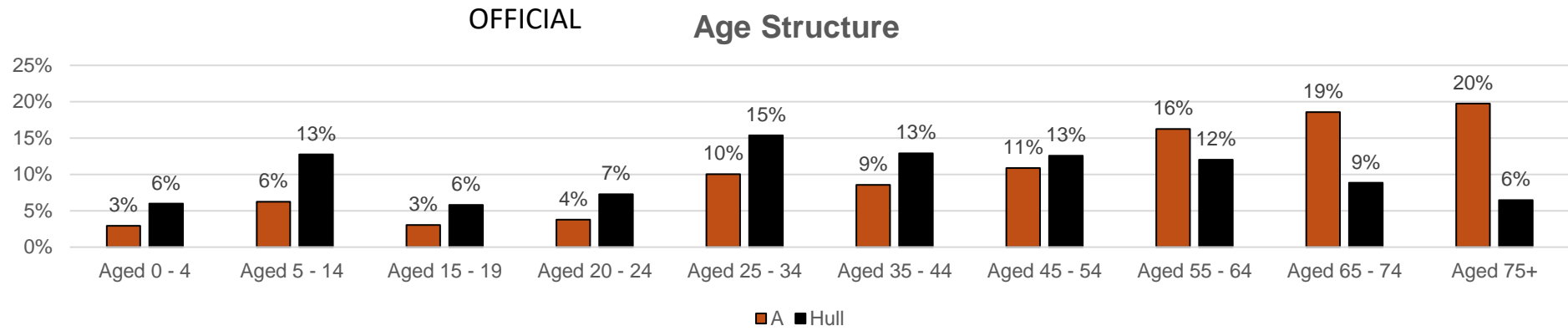

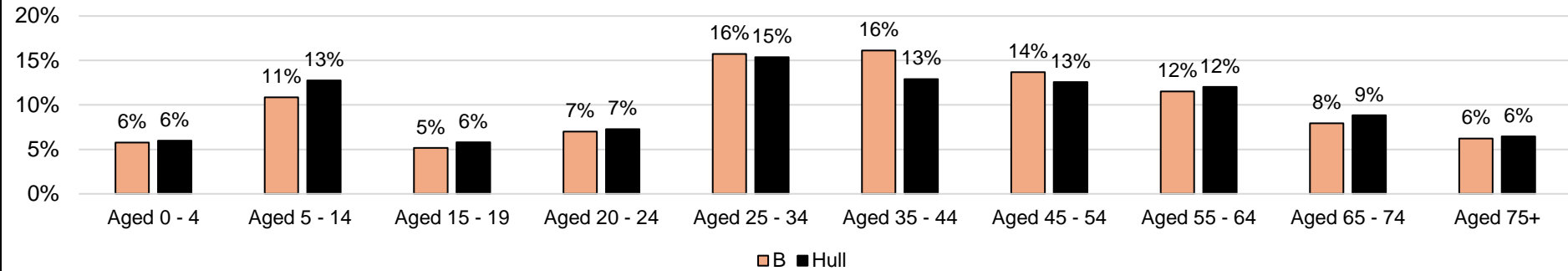

Segment C: Young Families Renting From Council in Areas of High Deprivation

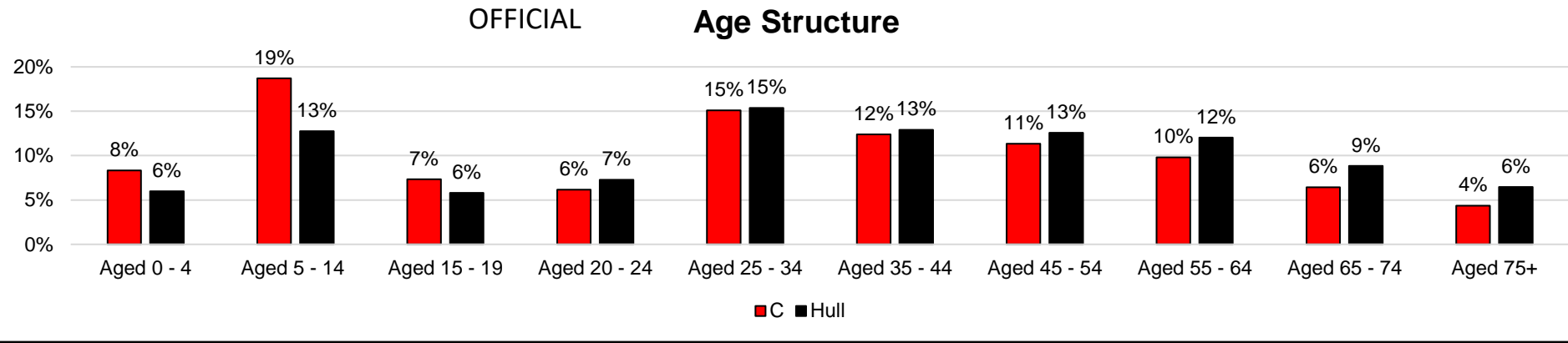

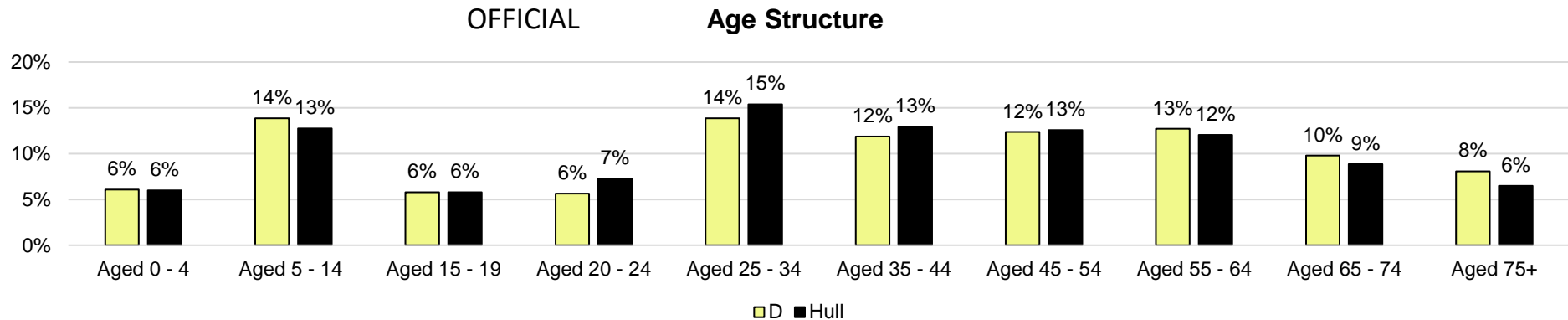

Segment E: Low Income Residents in High Density Private Rented Terraces

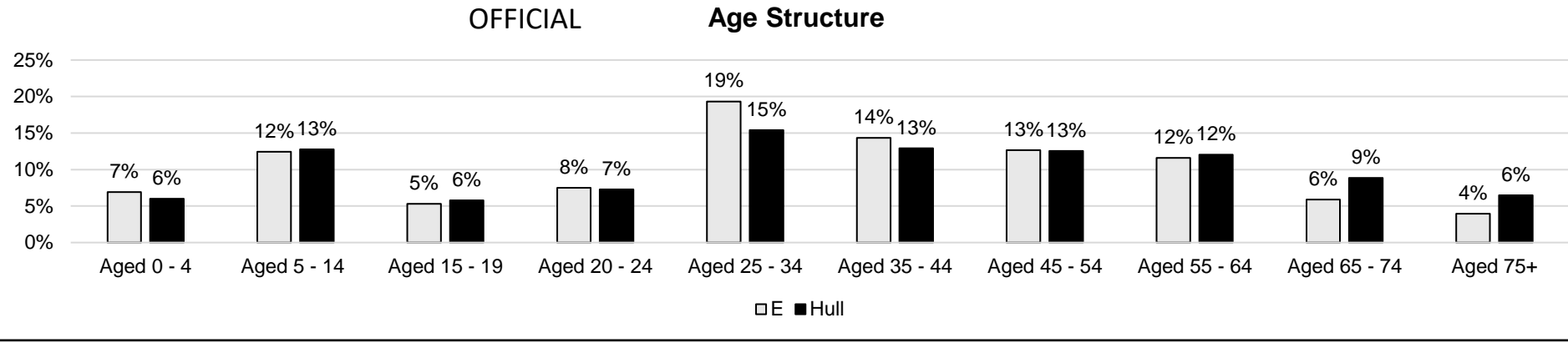

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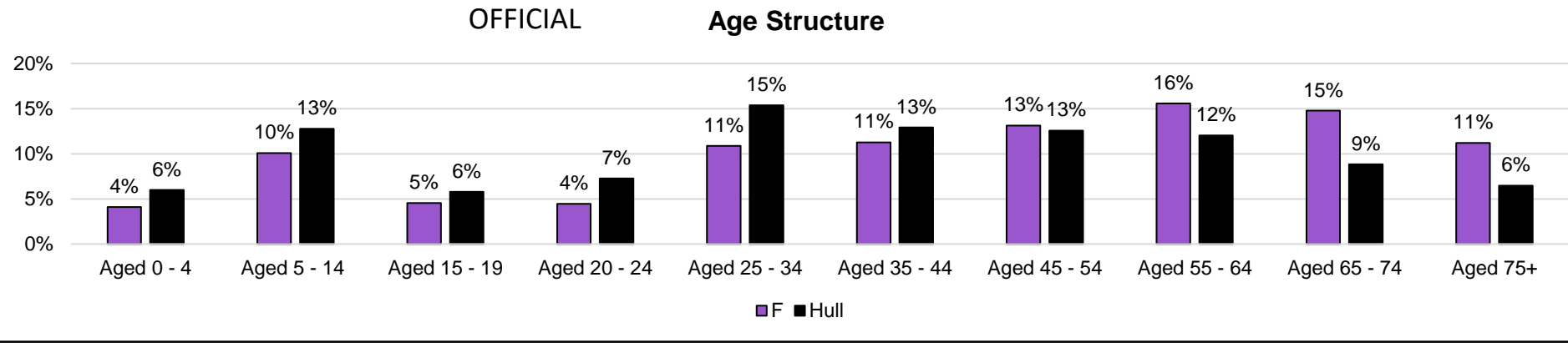

This group contains a high proportion of older (aged 55+), white UK born, “traditional” couples living in low density owner occupied, typically semidetached houses. Relatively healthy (although more likely to provide unpaid care), moderately educated, and mixing retired and economically active. Car ownership is high, and those in employment are more likely to work as intermediate professionals and managers / directors; particularly in public service, skilled trades, and construction.

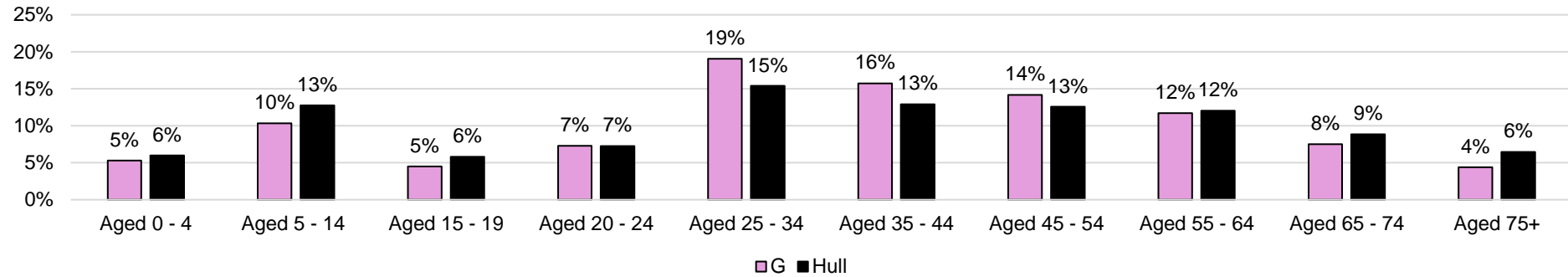

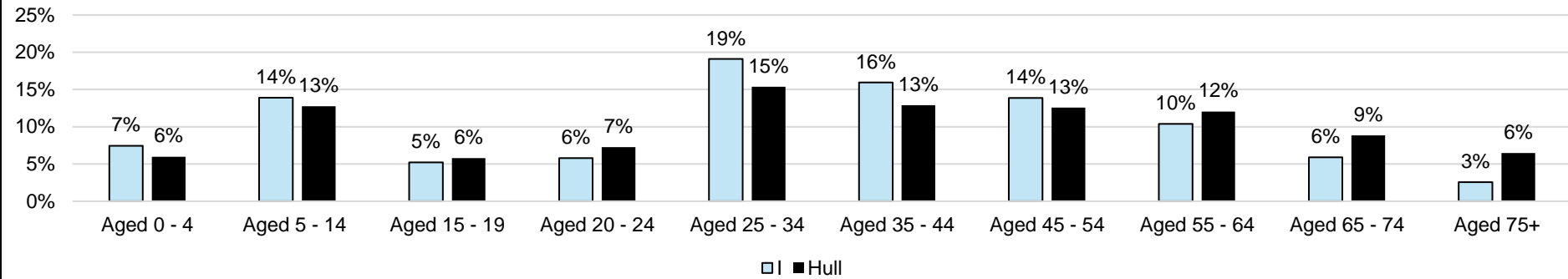

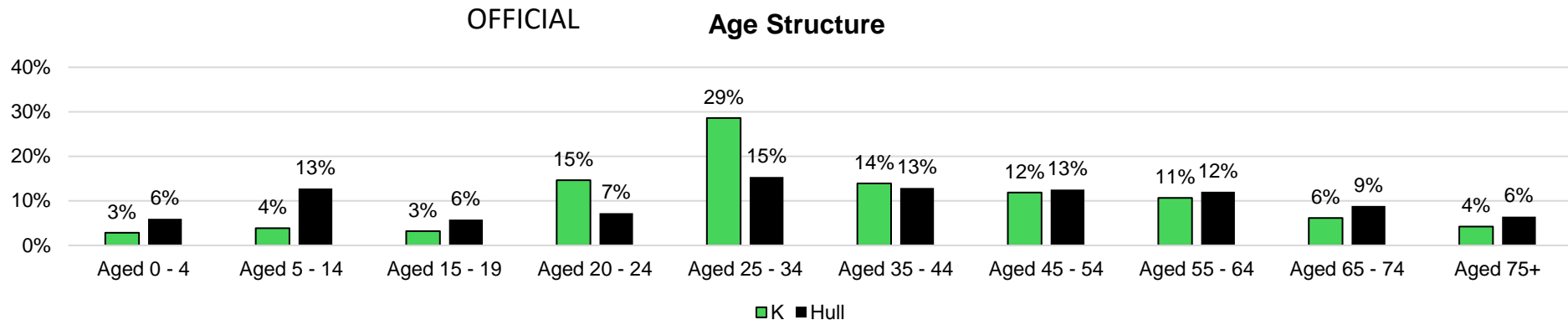
